## Visiting Shrines in Fushimi

### Deeply Connected with Japanese Sake Industry



#### Fushimi Sake Village

Visitors can enjoy local sake from 17 brewers at this Japanese sake theme park, which opened in March 2016. The park was designed as a narrow lane lined with 8 different shops featuring delicious food and sake counter service. All items are served to your table so you can try combinations of food and sake from each store without leaving your seat.



#### Teradaya Inn

This is the inn for sailors that became one of the stages where the history was made during the last days of the shogunate. The building is old so lintels are low and stairs steep.



#### Gokonomiya Shrine

Given the name Gokonomiya by an emperor in the Heian Period this name has continued to be passed down. The shrine buildings display many characteristics of Momoyama period architecture and the shrine is known as one of Japan's 100 famous waters and as Fushimi no Gokosui. Wheelchair access is possible by entering through the parking lot and using the pavement around the honden shrine to access the shrine's spring water.
