## Ono & Daigo Course

Kajuji Temple was built by Emperor Daigo to mourn his mother Fujiwara no Inshi; Zuishinin Temple famous as the temple related to Ono no Komachi, and Daigoji Temple at where the national treasure five-storied pagoda located. This course brings you to all three temples. In spring, you may see plum and cherry blossoms; in autumn, you can indulge in the splendid red leaves. Let's take a short stroll from the city center and be amazed by the beautiful seasons.



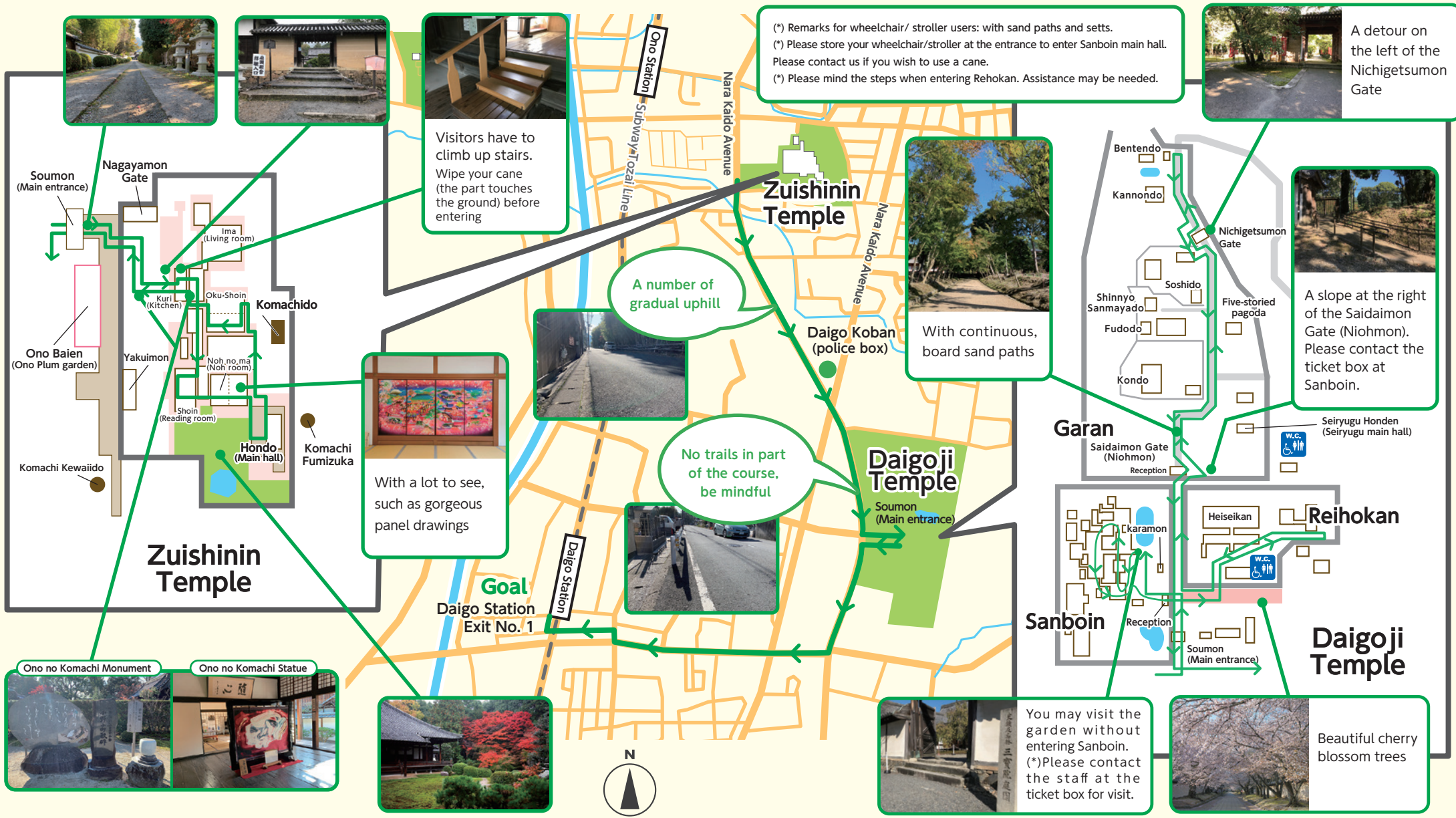
### Kajuji Temple

### Zuishinin Temple

(\*) Wheelchairs and strollers must be stored before admission

Opening hours: 9:00 -17:00 (last admission at 16:30)  
 Admission fees: Adult ¥500, high school/junior high school pupils ¥300  
 persons with disabilities ¥400, large group with 20 persons or above ¥450

(\*) Remarks for wheelchair/ stroller users: with sand paths and sets.  
 (\*) Please store your wheelchair/stroller at the entrance to enter Sanboin main hall. Please contact us if you wish to use a cane.  
 (\*) Please mind the steps when entering Rehokan. Assistance may be needed.

A detour on the left of the Nichigetsumon Gate

Visitors have to climb up stairs. Wipe your cane (the part touches the ground) before entering

A number of gradual uphill

With continuous, board sand paths

A slope at the right of the Saidaimon Gate (Niohmon). Please contact the ticket box at Sanboin.

No trails in part of the course, be mindful

Seiryugu Honden (Seiryugu main hall)

With a lot to see, such as gorgeous panel drawings

Beautiful cherry blossom trees
